I'm writing this letter to let you know of an exciting ministry opportunity with Engineering Ministries International (eMi) that I will be part of this summer. Before I get into the details of this opportunity, I will tell you how I decided to serve in this ministry this summer.




I learned about eMi while attending the Urbana Missions Conference 2015. It was there that I met some representatives from the eMi who talked to me about their work and vision. After Urbana '15, I went back to school and kept eMi in the back of my mind. I wanted to work with them the following summer, but I already had been talking with a civil engineering company for an internship. The summer-fall of 2016, I took a 6-month internship with Braun Intertec in Kansas City doing quality control, inspections, and materials testing for construction projects. During and after the internship, I couldn't get eMi out of my head. After praying and talking to my parents, I applied for an internship with eMi. A few weeks after being accepted as an intern with eMi, I went on a mission's trip to Mexico (not associated with eMi) to build a house for an impoverished family. The mission trip confirmed and fueled my desire to serve with eMi the summer of 2017.

Engineering Ministries International is a Christian, non-profit organization providing engineering services to ministries in the developing world that are actively sharing the Gospel and serving the community. This includes schools, hospitals, orphanages, churches, camps, and things of the like. Most of the project work is completed by interns like me. This is where you can serve alongside with me. The total cost of my internship is roughly \$5500. This includes training costs, travel costs, room, and board for 3 months. I cannot do this alone. I know that God has commissioned the church to send workers to the field to work for His kingdom. I trust that God will move in your heart to partner with me. I am confident that God will use me at eMi for His glory in furthering His work around the world. You can donate online at www.emiworld.org/donate.php.
